Those ranking in 1st or 2nd place in their category will qualify to advance to the National Contest.

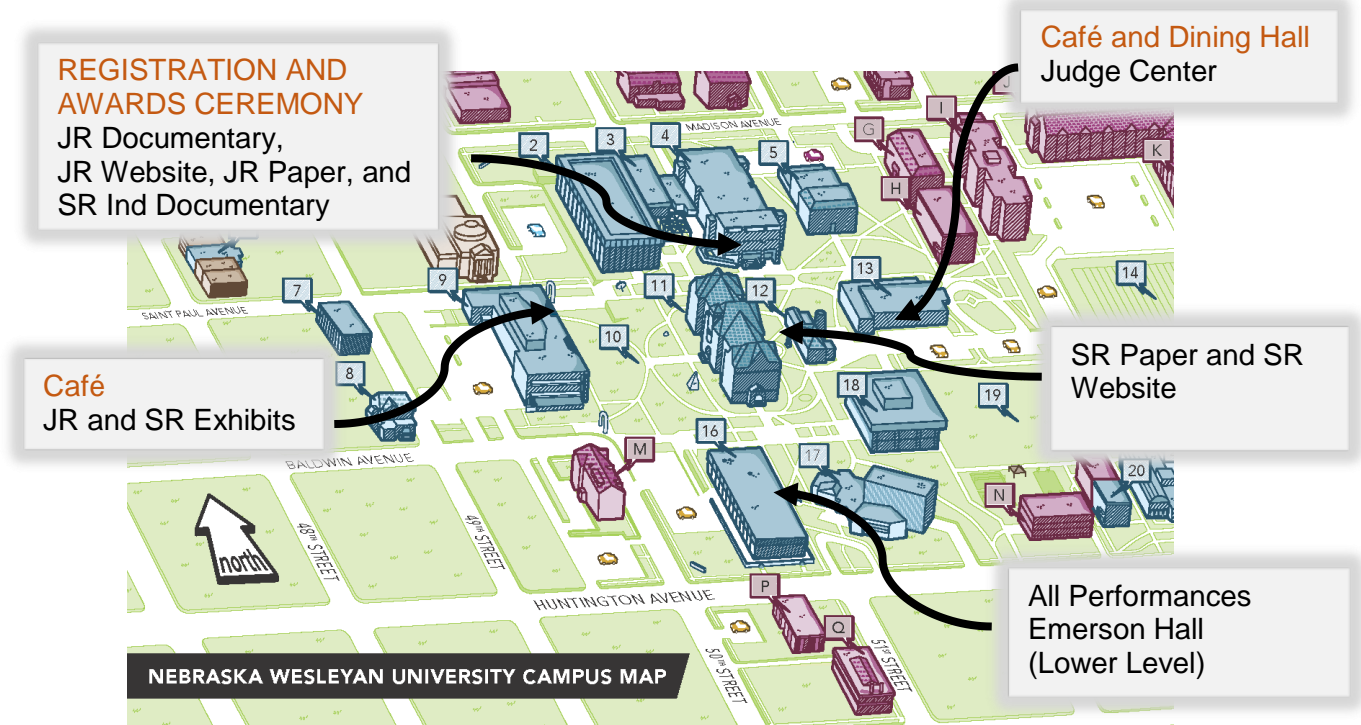

Students should report to their judging area at least 15 minutes ahead of their scheduled judging time. It is important that students be quiet and respectful of others who are being judged while they are waiting for their interview. Judges are volunteering their time and talents, be respectful of their observations and contributions.

Parking

On-Campus

Students, teachers, and families may park in any campus parking lot except those requiring a blue parking permit. Vehicles may be towed at the owner's expense if parked in areas posted Loading Zone, Deliveries Only, Fire Lanes, No Parking, or Handicapped Parking (without a Handicapped vehicle permit).

Exhibits can utilize the parking behind Acklie – avoiding blocking the alley or using parking spaces that belong to the apartment complex to the west.

Off-Campus

The City of Lincoln Ordinance prohibits parking within twenty-five feet of an intersection, within five feet of a driveway, and fifteen feet of a fire hydrant.
