

Clarence W. Wigington

Clarence W. Wigington was the first African American municipal architect. He was raised in North Omaha and attended art school in Omaha until 1902, where he started working as an architect full time. He designed multiple churches as well as houses in Omaha. Later in his life he moved to St. Paul, Minnesota, where he worked as the senior architect for the city.
