

TOPIC SELECTION

HISTORY DAY

Selecting a History Day topic is a process of gradually narrowing down the area of history in which you are interested and focusing on a manageable subject.

Keep in mind the following when selecting a general topic and when narrowing your topic.

- The topic should be of interest to you.
- Make sure the topic fits the theme. (Consult with your teacher).
- The topic should be significant and important enough that everyone should know about it.
- The topic should be in-depth and narrow in scope. It is better to focus on one issue in detail than to cover many issues superficially.
- The topic should reflect the availability of primary and secondary resources. A local topic is often a good choice, since primary documents are more likely to be available in the community in which an event occurred or in which a person lived.
